PATI Information Statement

Name of Public Authority: Ministry of Economy and Labour Headquarters

Introduction:

The Public Access to Information 2010 (PATI) legislation was designed to make central Government, and the larger public sector, more open and accountable by giving the public the legally enforceable right to request and access information subject to limited and prescribed exemptions. Each public authority is required to produce an information statement that give the public an overview of the types of information accessible through the public authority.

This information statement provides information on the functions and services of the Ministry of Economy and Labour and the classes of records held.

Section A: Structure, Organization and Legislation [s5(1)a]

The Ministry of Economy and Labour comprises several departments and agencies, including Ministry Headquarters, the Department of Financial Assistance, the Department of Immigration, the Department of Workforce Development, the Department of Labour, the Department of Economic Development, Consumer Affairs and the Department of Statistics.

The department head reports directly to the Permanent Secretary for Economy and Labour. In addition, the Ministry has responsibility for any statutory bodies or committees that may be appointed by the Minister from time to time. These boards report to the Minister through the Permanent Secretary.

The Ministry of Economy and Labour Headquarters is the coordinating body for the Departments that fall under the Economy and Labour banner. The Ministry Headquarters executes its duties by employing five (5) full-time employees.

Section B: 1) Functions, powers, duties of the Authority [s5(1)b]

The mission of the Ministry of Economy and Labour is "To drive economic growth and job creation." The mission of the Ministry Headquarters is "To establish effective policy that helps foster the expansion of jobs and economic growth."

The Ministry of Economy and Labour Headquarters provides leadership, oversight and coordination to address Ministry business; programme management and departmental operations with the Ministry; and formulation and implementation of policy and legislation within the Ministry.

Roles and Responsibilities

The Ministry of Economy and Labour Headquarters is responsible for providing advice on the formulation of policy within the Departments and public bodies regulated by the Ministry. Headquarters must also direct and coordinate operations and activities with the Ministry.

The primary objectives of the Ministry of Economy and Labour Headquarters are:

- Implement Comprehensive Immigration Reform by providing oversight of process improvements, policy and legislative changes, and IT system upgrades and enhancements.
- Oversee Financial Assistance Reform, including policy and legislative changes and operational enhancements.
- Oversee the Department of Workforce Development for the Reemployment and Reintegration Jobs Strategy.
- Oversee the Labour Relations Section to implement the new Labour Code (Employment Act amendments and consolidated Labour Law).
- Oversee the Department of Statistics for the distribution of data and other relevant
- Oversee the Economic Development Department to implement economic growth
